

CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: ENFORCEMENT PROCESS



CMC reviews breaches and decides measures



Aim: restore compliance



Directives = main tool

- Creates platform for dialogue with FIAU
- Focus on tangible & effective change (not just on paper)





CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: TYPES OF DIRECTIVES

Remediation Directive	Follow-up Directive
Lighter oversight	More intrusive
Minimal requests for information/documentation	Multiple requests for information/documentation/clarifications



CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: TWO-PHASE APPROACH

Phase 1: Technical Compliance

Are policies and procedures in place?



Phase 2: Effectiveness

Do they work in practice?





COOPERATION & COMMUNICATION

Why it matters:

- Smooths process, avoids delays
- Builds trust
- Makes corrective measures practical
- Resolves issues before escalation


Good practices:

- Keep open communication
- Share updates regularly
- Be transparent about challenges
- Use meetings as opportunities
